Pastor's Corner

Press on to Know the Lord

Lent is a time for repentance and renewal, and we often give up something. We may skip meals or avoid foods that are not healthy. We may limit social media or other habits that have become addictive. It feels like we are sacrificing something for God.

But the word of the Lord that came to the prophet Hosea mentioned a different kind of renewal. At the time of this prophecy, God's people had turned to worshipping a god named Baal. As they transgressed the covenant God made with them out of love, they went from faithful to faithless. And the Lord made it clear that he saw their sin but was not demanding more sacrifices:

“With their flocks and herds they shall go to seek the Lord, but they will not find him; he has withdrawn from them.” (Hosea 5:6)

God wanted his people to come empty-handed. He wanted direct contact so they could renew that love relationship:

“For I desire steadfast love and not sacrifice, the knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings.” (Hosea 6:6)

When we sacrifice something for God or use good works to win God's favor, we feel better for going out of our way; but we may not enjoy a fulfilling relationship. God wants our whole hearts. He does not need our sacrifices, and we cannot make up to God the damage that sin has caused. God desires right relationship, which was won for us by precious blood of Jesus Christ.

Restored relationship is deep; a commitment or promise has been violated, and that closeness suffers. In the presence of the Lord, there are all kinds of good things such as refreshment, forgiveness and joy. We do not have to be afraid of what the Lord may say.

For Lent 2026, seek the Lord for the sake of knowing him better. Instead of sacrificing to make up the score, get heart-to-heart.

- If you choose some kind of self-denial for Lent, tell the Lord that you are taking away distractions or obstacles in order to seek him.
- If you choose a food fast, use that time spent preparing or eating food to communicate with the Lord. That extra time in prayer may allow for more closeness.
- If you spend more time in prayer for Lent, allow for some unstructured time when you do nothing but listen to God. Take the prayer request list and turn it over to the blank side; then write down whatever the Lord tells you.



ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL*Jon Beige***Apportionment Giving Update**

Thank you for your faithful giving over the past few years as we navigated through a season of unexpected challenges. We want to take this opportunity to provide an update on our apportionment commitment. We have made some changes, however we continue to offer options to make sure that donations can be designated as you see fit.

Apportionment giving is the money we give to our church each week that is divided and distributed throughout the United Methodist Church. Through our apportioned giving, we are able to participate in the ministry and mission of the United Methodist Church both locally and around the world. Each church in the WPA Conference has a set amount for apportionment giving, and this total changes each year. Historically, we have given 100 percent of our set amount.

Our Administrative Council at Unionville Church made the decision in late 2024 to withhold some (10 percent) of our allotted apportionment as a way to express dissatisfaction with some of the outcomes of the UMC General Conference in 2024. We also decided to change the way we would pay our apportionment total for 2025; we decided to pay 10% of undesignated tithes and offerings to our apportionment amount. Additionally, we voiced concerns with General Conference decisions to our Bishop and District Superintendent when each of them came to visit Unionville Church. We also created a new giving category, "Unionville Use Only". These funds can be used for Unionville's budgetary needs but not for apportionments or any external cause.

As we prepared to go forward into 2026 and beyond, we needed to decide how to handle our apportionment commitment. At the most recent Administrative Council meeting, after a period of discussion and prayer, members voted to return to full apportionment giving. The "Unionville Use Only" donation category will remain for anyone who feels their tithes and offerings should not go to needs outside the local church.

Some of the reasons for our Administrative Council decision are as follows:

The vast majority of apportionment funding stays in the Western PA Conference and are used to keep churches open and running, fund UMCOR, and spread the Good News of Jesus Christ. Unionville has accepted grant money from the conference in the past, and the source of this funding was local church apportionment giving. This was needed to help cover costs after a negative financial outlook going into the year 2025. The generous giving from everyone in the congregation thankfully changed that outlook. Thank you, God!

We discussed that apportionments can be looked at as a bill sent to Unionville Church. Like any other bill, we have to pay it, and we don't have much say in how that money is used. It is part of being a United Methodist Church, and we currently don't have any options that would allow us to leave the denomination.

We encourage everyone to continue giving in the way you each feel called; give generously of your time, talents, and treasures. Gifts can still be made to the General Fund, Unionville Use Only, or any other specific ministry that Unionville Church takes part in.

We have gone through a season of unexpected challenges; we have had some disagreements. It has been heartbreaking to have some of our members leave our fellowship. As we lament, we are seeking healing from the Lord and unity in the Body of Jesus Christ. My prayer is that we keep showing grace to one another in our disagreements, and to continue to love and support each other. I pray that we stay focused on the great commission given by Jesus in Matthew 28:16-20: to go and make disciples of all nations.





SPRNG IS COMING AND CLAYTON'S ARMY IS ON THE MARCH AGAIN!

On Saturday May 16 the Pittsburgh Region Cystic Fibrosis Foundation will hold its annual Great Strides 5K Walk to raise money for research to fight cystic fibrosis – a rare, genetic, life-shortening disease that makes it difficult to breathe. At this time there is still no cure for it. Most patients die before the age of 45. That number is up from 25, which is what it was when David was in graduate school in 1971.

Once again, we're walking as part of Clayton's Army. Clayton Himmler is our nephew. Clayton is now 8 and a half years old and, most of the time, he looks pretty healthy – largely due to the care his parents (Dale and Jennifer) give him and some experimental drugs. Nevertheless, he and his parents have to be very careful about infections. A minor chest cold could send him to the hospital.

Last year, Clayton's Army raised a bit more than \$3,355.00; the total for the Great Strides Walk was around \$300,000. This year, we hope to do better. Most of the money raised is used for research.

Once again, we're asking for your help. It's a 5K walk. Could you donate 20 cents a kilometer (\$1.00)? Or 40 cents (\$2.00)? Or \$1.00 (\$5.00)? Or some other amount?

If you're willing to be one of our sponsors, you could give your donation to Nancy or Dave at church some Sunday. Or you could mail it to us: 201 Mowry Road, Monaca, PA 15061. If you use a check, make it out to Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. On the memo line write "Clayton's Army."
