## ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL

On June 23<sup>rd</sup> we had a congregational meeting to discuss the changes that the United Methodist Church has made at the General Conference a few months ago. I'm sure that most people have heard of the changes at this point, but the changes that stand out the most are a shift in the denomination's stance on LGBTQ marriages, LGBTQ ordinations, and removing any official pathway for disaffiliation from the denomination.

The congregational meeting was very well attended, and we had some spirited discussions on these topics. The overwhelming feeling at the meeting is that Unionville considers ourselves to be a traditional congregation and we feel that the denomination is moving in a "worldly" direction instead of adhering to the scriptures.

Nothing that was discussed at this meeting involved any binding decisions at this point. The purpose was to share a brief message from our Bishop and the North Eastern Council of Bishops with the congregation, and to give everyone a chance to share their opinions on the topic. I think everyone agreed that this is something that needs a lot of prayer. Please pray for Unionville, and for the United Methodist Church as a whole. We plan to hold further congregational meetings in the coming months, and would love to hear feedback from anyone who was not able to attend the last meeting (*please see Jon for a survey questionnaire*), as well as hearing again from the people who were there.

As we prayerfully move forward with the work of our congregation, we ask each of you and we ask God to help Unionville remain the same loving and welcoming place that we have always been. We seek to continue to serve our community, spread the gospel, study the Bible, and grow stronger faith in people of all ages. Unionville will continue to work towards these goals regardless of what the United Methodist Church decides now or in the future. I ask everyone to remain patient as we try to figure out our long term options, and please keep praying.

## PRAYER MINISTRY

***The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective. ~James 5:16***

I saved this article until last, literally just before we go to print. Admittedly my thoughts are scrambled and so I'm just going off the cuff as the Lord leads. I've been doing a lot of thinking about, studying about and praying about the power of prayer. As I have sat in the church office and taken the calls for many prayer requests through the years I have come to a couple of conclusions. We are rich in the belief that there is power in prayer and rightly so, we have seen many prayers answered, some even miraculously over the years; however I suspect that many of us are fully dependent upon the prayers of others to make our requests known to God.

Now I don't pretend to know what any of your prayer lives are like, but I am using this article as a call to action for each one of us to examine our prayer habits. I know for myself, there are days that get busy and I am lucky to squeak out a few words in passive conversation with God throughout my day. I know I can do a better job and I'm guessing you can too.

One of the books I have read is called "The Potential and Power of Prayer", I would like to use this book as a small group study if any are interested. In this book the author states, "*Many believers have never learned to pray because no one intentionally taught them to pray.*" He goes on to say, "*Many churches are guilty of telling believers to pray without teaching them how to do it. The result is frustration—Christians who want to be obedient to God in prayer but are not certain how to do it. Even many courses on prayer are more focused on the transfer of information than the practice of prayer.*" So how do we teach people to pray? Well if you want to learn something and learn to do it well, you do it, and then you do it again and again. There is no right or wrong way to pray, but you must do it.

***For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.***

***Matthew 18:20***

I am currently working on putting together a series of Prayer Meetings. These will be small group meetings at the homes of those willing to host. A small group allows for more vulnerability and less pressure among participants. I will soon have available a Meeting Outline for those who want or feel they need it but there is no set right or wrong way to do this, so long as we gather to pray. If you are willing to host at your home, or your campsite, around a campfire, etc., please let me know a date and time that works for you and we can talk about more details. "Praying together is one way we fight spiritual battles arm in arm." There is power in God's people praying together.

*"The God of the Bible is a communicating God who invites us to come to him in prayer. He hears the cries of his people, even though sometime we do not recognize that truth. When we study the stories about prayer in the Bible, we learn a valuable lesson about God's power and faithfulness."*

Not only did Jesus teach us to pray but he relied on prayer, regular conversation with the Father while he walked on earth. If Jesus needed this constant interaction with the Father, how much more do we? We see examples of praying people and God answering prayer throughout the Old and New Testaments. I am believing for God to do powerful things in and through Unionville Church. Come and be a part. Let's see together what God can and will do for a people with their eyes solely upon Him.

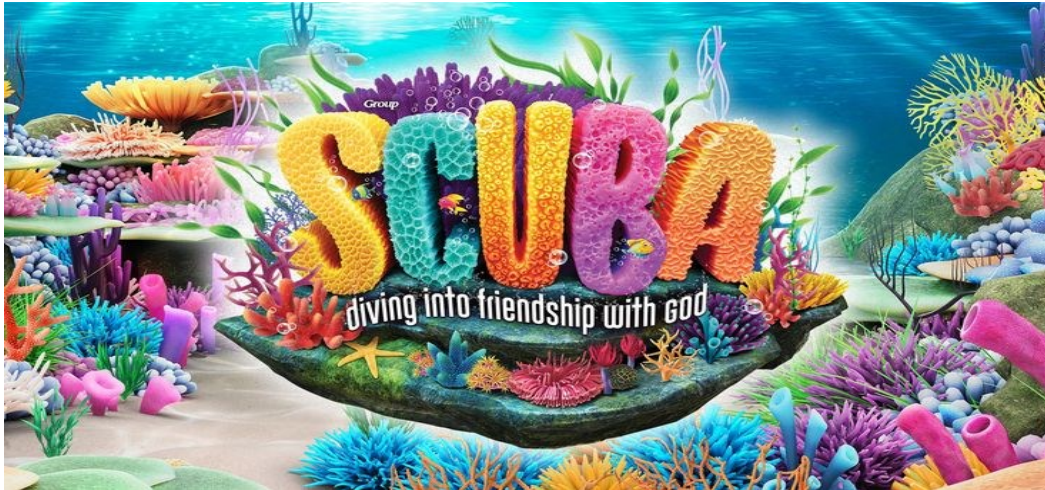

## GENERAL CONFERENCE REFLECTION

For years, I have described myself as being slightly right of center. To some I have described myself as being 3 or 4 “clicks” right of center with the recognition that I don’t know how big a “click” is or how many “clicks” there are. But it has served as a helpful tool in dialogue with others who have then self-reflected on where they would see themselves on the spectrum from far left to far right.

I am a General Conference junkie or as some would say, a “methogeek”. That is to say, I have loved the environment of the General Conference and watching the whole process (not for the faint of heart and if you’ve ever watched sausage made, there are apt comparisons). I was first introduced to the General Conference in 1988 while I was in seminary and had the privilege of serving as the lead meeting/event planner for the 2008 and 2012 General Conferences. I’ve had the privilege of leading classes within my congregations and within the district for several general conferences.

When I attended this General Conference, it was not without experience or understanding, yet, I will readily admit I was surprised at how quickly the theological pendulum swung from one direction to another. I knew and expected there would be a move theologically to a more “progressive” view or that is to say, more to the left. I never expected it to move as quickly and thoroughly as it did.

As the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of General Conference unfolded with decisions made, I found myself to become completely disoriented. My opening descriptive above of my theological position was no longer relevant. Center has moved. Now I don’t know how many clicks to the right of center I am, but it is definitely more than 3 or 4.

Regardless of where I personally am on that theological spectrum, I have always had a concern for justice and a desire for administrative processes that are just. It greatly saddened me that no version of 2553, the short-lived paragraph that permitted disaffiliations, was adopted. Given the seismic shift within the denomination, I believe it would have been the right and just thing to adopt some version of 2553 as a continuing process even if time limited.

Throughout my ministry I have preached from the Bible. I preach Jesus crucified and resurrected for our salvation. My ministry has been extended to all people to the extent that I was able to provide the needed ministry regardless of any demographic category by which a person might be identified.

Knowing the largest immediate elephant in the room is what about weddings especially for persons who identify as LGBTQ+, let me share the following. As a pastor, I have always had the ability to choose or not choose to do a wedding, that has been reaffirmed by the General Conference. There have been a couple of times in which I have specifically turned down doing a wedding. There have been couples who have chosen to go elsewhere because they did not desire to engage in pre-marriage counseling. I require four to five 2-hour classes of pre-marriage counseling done by me or another pastor with which I have a trusted relationship. That takes time over several weeks, if not months, to make happen. I’m not sure when the last wedding was held at Unionville and the next one isn’t until fall 2026. The likelihood of a wedding being scheduled in my remaining time as your pastor is unlikely. However, should a request come up, I will follow the lead of the congregation which has at this point been expressed to not perform LGBTQ+ weddings.

Here's what I am clear about. Regardless of what name is on our signboard and what our denominational affiliation is, the ministry that happens within our congregation is our responsibility together. The future of Unionville Church is and always will be tied to the willingness of members to not only offer hospitality to those who enter our doors but to be intentionally invitational of others to come be a part of our ministries, our worship life, and our community of faith. As I look around the sanctuary on any average Sunday, I am concerned for what the congregation will look like in 5 years or 10 years from now. But this is not just about survival of the congregation. Jesus commanded us to “make disciples”. The future of each congregation and of Christianity in general as well as the saving grace of God open to each person is based on God’s plan that (continued on next page)

each generation will tell the saving story of Jesus Christ that others may come to know the saving power of the cross.

Every person needs to be engaged in continuous life-long growing in discipleship that in our daily living, we will look a little more like Jesus than we did the day before and that we will be part of nurturing others to do likewise.

That is the ministry to which I was called, to which I am ordained, and to which I intend to continue leading the congregation to pursue. My hope and my prayer is that you will be willing to engage in that process with me, that each of us may faithfully grow in what it means to be a follower of Christ.

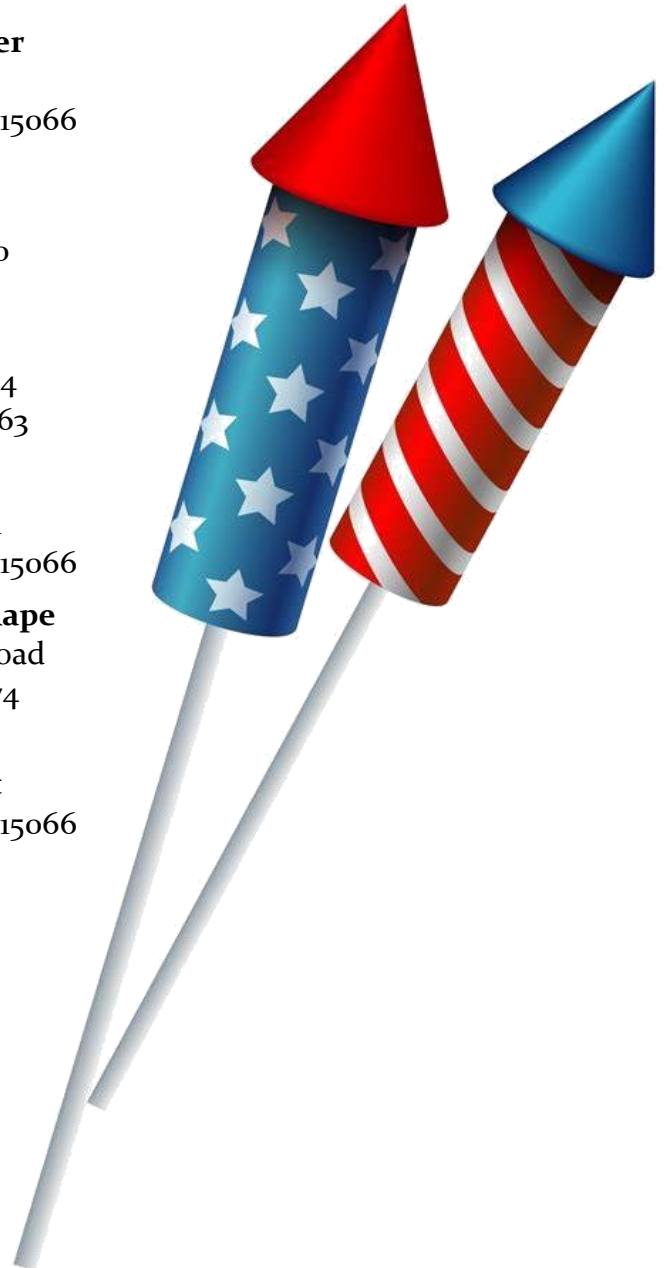
