As a child interested in the presidency, I spent a lot of energy on learning all things related. I could have told you the names of all the Presidents and when they served (don't ask me now, I've forgotten). I could tell you a lot about the history of the White House. I looked forward to Lincoln's and Washington's birthdays. I've visited their homes several times. I watched all the Watergate hearings that were televised, and I always watched the inauguration. Most of the decisions they have made have not had that much direct effect on my life. Oh yes, cost of living, interest rates have fluctuated, the market has gone up and down and up again. But all in all, my life has not been changed that much by whoever sits in the White House. I know this may not be true for you. I also recognize that I have lived a life of privilege regardless of my economic status at any given point.

The most profound changes in my life have not had anything to do with who is in political power in my community, my state, or my nation. The most profound changes in my life have had everything to do with the relationships I have developed in my life. Some of those relationships have been with you and others who will read this newsletter. Certainly, my family: parents, siblings, extended family, wife, son, daughter-in-law, and granddaughter count huge among those relationships.

The most significant relationship has been with God. God is the keeper of my going out and my coming in every day (Psalm 121). This day and all the days ahead will be in God's hands regardless of who is elected to any office.

As many of you know, I have been leading the Good News Club at Freedom for 6 years now and have been a part of the team for 9. Good News Club is part of a nationwide group called Child Evangelism Fellowship. Beaver County has it's own unit and is able to host clubs in almost every elementary school in the county. Praise God!

Good News Club ministries take place in neighborhood settings such as homes, schools and community centers all over the world and are designed to bring the Gospel of Christ to children on their level in their environment.

Like most ministries, GNC operates on donations. The Freedom club is held at the elementary school each Wednesday for 8 weeks, starting Jan 29th. There are seven adult leaders and five high school student volunteers. I am the "go to" adult and main teacher with Janna and Gregory both being high school student volunteers. I am asking for donations of small bottles of water and snacks (individually packaged and not to contain nuts). Monetary donations are always welcome and I can go shopping.

At GNC the students learn scripture and how to let God into their lives through interactive Bible lessons, repetitive scripture review games, songs, and some acting done by the leaders and students. This year we are studying the life of Moses. I have witnessed so many kids grow in Christ throughout the many years I have been involved with CEF.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

A typical flight from Wichita to DC takes about 2 hours and 40 minutes. For 64 passengers making that flight on January 29th, it was eternity. A story of one passenger was reported on Facebook to have been originally scheduled for a later flight but switched to the earlier ill fated flight. I don't know if that's true or not as another story circulating but since turned out to be false was of a young man turned away at the gate, unable to board the doomed flight, thereby saving his life.

Overseas wars have been raging, hurricanes here in the US have ravaged cities, flooding has wiped out communities, fires have left cities and towns in ashes.

The bible tells us that in the last days, these are the things we will see and so many are predicting Jesus' return in the very near future, just as many have predicted over the years and for the very same reasons. Scripture also tells us that we will not know the day or time Jesus will return but that He surely will. All through scripture we are told to be ready.

Daily, the news is filled with tragedy and death. Just recently a woman out searching for a lost cat, was suddenly swallowed by a sink hole, 2 local families wiped out by family members who for whatever reason decided in an instant to take their own lives but not before first taking the lives of all other family members. Car accidents, train derailments and yes even plane crashes swallow up life.

Our prayer chains are filled with people in need and suffering. Disease is not bound by age perimeters. Young and old alike are suffering the same devastating diagnosis.

All through scripture we are told to be ready. Life is fleeting. Life can change in an instant and yet...we run through life day to day as though it has no end. Our schedules are brimming with busyness in all forms; we can scarcely catch our breaths before the next activity is upon us.

When do we take time to be ready? When do we take time to make sure others around us are ready? When do we become burdened for those who are lost and in need of Christ? When do we prepare ourselves to be able to help others be prepared? When do we invite others to come meet Jesus?

Not only are we responsible to ready ourselves but we are called to be disciples and to disciple others.

Put on the full armor of God and ready yourself for surely eternity is waiting and it could be as soon as in the next second, the next hour, or even the next 2 hours and 40 minutes.....

We have interacted with at least 27 children, 25 youth, and 68 adults on the discipleship pathway in the year 2024. What this means is that each of these persons accounted for, attended at least one Christian Education program, event or class in 2024. Sadly, some only attended one.

Vacation Bible School continues to be the crowning jewel as 33 adults, 14 youth, and 84 children interacted for five fun-filled nights in 2024. Sadly, some only attended one night.

We don't age out of learning. We will never know fully until we meet Jesus face to face.
There's a place for you!

Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come. But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what time of night the thief was coming, he would have kept watch and would not have let his house be broken into. So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him. -Matthew 24:42-44

And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near. ~Hebrews 10:25

There are many opportunities for us to gather and talk about and learn about God and His Word, just as there are opportunities for us to join together in corporate prayer settings. Come and be a part.

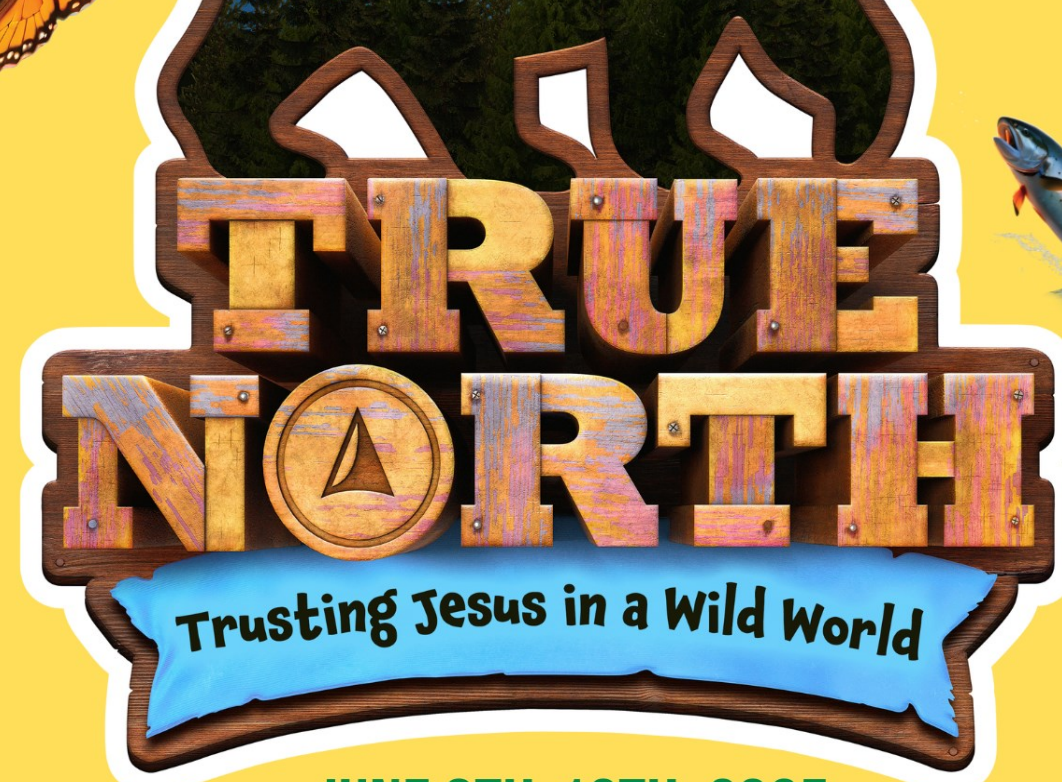

Here we are at the beginning of February, the daylight hours are getting longer, snow is melting, and spring is coming.

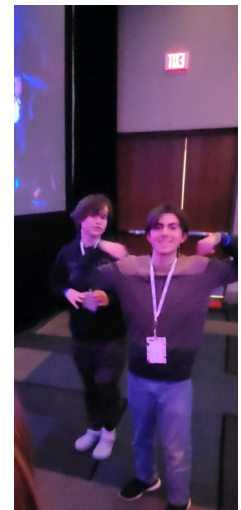
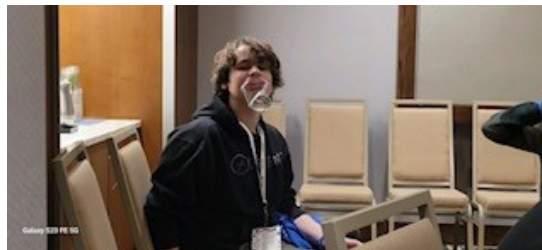

This past month we had to move our normal 3rd Tuesday to the next week due to the weather conditions. We soon found out we did not have all the info needed to contact everyone. Jo Shane came to the rescue with most of the telephone numbers needed. Keeping all this info at our fingertips will keep us be better informed as well as our Patrons.

We are now averaging between 40-45 people per month. Debbie & Mike Catalano do all our shopping for the Pantry and this last month they spent \$2,400.00 to fill our shelves. You can imagine with the way the food prices are rising so is the Pantry's needs. We are "Blessed" that Oak Grove Church still brings us groceries on a regular basis. We ask that if you find a little extra in your pocket book, think of the Pantry!

We can always use cleaning supplies such as All Purpose Cleaners, Spic N Span, Glass Cleaner, Bleach, Laundry Detergent, and Dish Soap. Paper Products such as toilet paper, paper towels and Kleenex are also needed. We usually pick up cleaning supplies at the Dollar Store. They are cheap and you can get more for your money!

We thank all of you who donate, come down and give of your time and for those who pray for our needs. Believe me we see the prayers working all the time! Most of all we thank Jo Shane for her tireless work with women who can never measure up to the compassion and love for each of the people's needs. They love her!!!
