Spring!

What's in a word? Spring, is a wonderful word. As a verb, it means to move upward or forward or suddenly. It can also mean to appear, to emerge, or to arise. As a noun, it refers to an elastic device; a small stream of water; a source, beginning, or motive; or a season of the year that is a time of growth and renewal. As an adjective, it speaks of the season of the year or of the resiliency of something.

As I write, we are about halfway through Lent on our way to Holy Week. For a pastor, sometimes the week is anything but "Holy", it is more like "Hectic Week". Yet, when I think back to 20 years ago when I moved to Nashville to begin serving on the denominational staff for a few years, I remember that I didn't really miss the pulpit until Holy Week. Although I was participating in the choir and took an active role in speaking parts of worship, it wasn't the same as being the pastor of a congregation going on this Lent to Holy Week to Easter journey. That experience gives me a clue of what retirement might bring for me.

It is a time in which things begin to appear, emerge, and arise as the daffodils around the parsonage and the Easter flowers of past years are now fully in bloom beside the sanctuary. 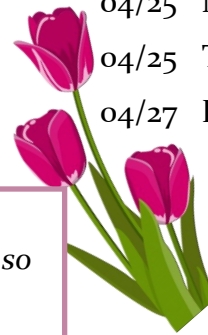

CLAYTON'S ARMY IS ON THE MARCH AGAIN!

On Saturday May 17 the Pittsburgh Region Cystic Fibrosis Foundation will hold its annual Great Strides 5K Walk to raise money for research to fight cystic fibrosis – a rare, genetic, life-shortening disease that makes it difficult to breathe. At this time there is still no cure for it. At present there are some 40,000 patients in the USA and another 65,000-70,000 overseas. Most patients die before the age of 45.

Once again, we'll be walking as part of Clayton's Army. Clayton Himmler is our nephew. Clayton is now 7 and a half years old and, most of the time, he looks pretty healthy – largely due to the care his parents (Dale and Jennifer) give him and some experimental drugs. Nevertheless, he and his parents have to be very careful about infections. A minor chest cold could send him to the hospital.

The last time we were able to participate (2 years ago), Clayton's Army raised just under \$10,000; the total for the Great Strides Walk was around \$300,000. This year, we hope to do better. Most of the money raised is used for research.

We're asking for your help. It's a 5K walk. Could you donate 20 cents a kilometer (\$1.00)? Or 40 cents (\$2.00)? Or \$1.00 (\$5.00)? Or some other amount?

If you're willing to be one of our sponsors, you could give your donation to Nancy or Dave at church some Sunday. Or you could mail it to us: 201 Mowry Road, Monaca, PA 15061. If you use a check, make it out to Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. On the memo line write "Clayton's Army."

Help us to help Clayton and the other kids have the chance to grow old.
