

There is No Loneliness in Prayer

In his song "Narrow Road," Chris Renzema's lyrics are an honest conversation with Jesus:

"You said it'd be a narrow road This world will never be my home The journey might be lonely But I'd never be alone."

The songwriter doesn't deny the feeling of loneliness, but he does add that Jesus promised we will never be all alone. Prayer is a great way to snap back into the reality of speaking with the One who is always with us.

We may have started our walk with Jesus thinking prayer was a duty, channel for blessings or strategy to survive life. But prayer grows along with our relationship with God. We can get used to taking refuge in the presence of the Lord at any time. We can renew our relationship with God, seek insight from Heaven, and realign our thoughts with God's. Through prayer, we find the way forward again. As we walk and talk with Jesus, it grows deeper, just like any beautiful and lasting friendship.

I remember praying in children's church; we would start with, "Dear Jesus," and Mrs. Kurzrok would help us direct our praises and prayer requests to Jesus. As children who had not developed our tendency to doubt everything, it did not feel odd to speak with someone we couldn't see. Jesus was there, hearing every faith-filled word.

An additional way to pray is LIKE Jesus. This is taking Jesus up on his advice to pray in the way he directed. In the Lord's prayer, we confirm the most Holy name of our God, invite his eternal Kingdom and perfect will into the present moment, request the provision he promised, request forgiveness for sins, forgive others (being forgiven always goes with forgiving others), ask for help avoiding and being delivered from the evil we run into here on earth. We end by affirming God's sovereignty: the eternal kingdom really belongs to God, and God retains all power and deserves all the glory. Sometimes we adapt the prayer into our own words or emphasize certain parts, but when we pray the Lord's prayer, we can be assured we are praying like Jesus. We should call it "the disciple's prayer" because it was given first to the 12 disciples of Jesus, and it teaches us to live as disciples of Jesus.

In addition to praying TO Jesus and LIKE Jesus, there is another way: praying WITH Jesus. And there are few examples of this in the Bible because Jesus often went to desolate places to pray alone. But as Jesus prepared to make his ultimate and world-changing sacrifice, we get new insight for (continued on page 5)

praying. In the garden of Gethsemane, we learn his own prayer requests. He asks if there is a way to avoid the next painful part of his mission. We also get a posture of Jesus praying: he falls to the ground in deep sorrow, and the beads of sweat on his body change into drops of blood. This kind of prayer is more intimate; we hear the emotions of Jesus and see his heart. And we can pray this way also. We can pray with Jesus for the same things he is praying for.

When we pray TO Jesus or LIKE Jesus or WITH Jesus, the most important part is Jesus. Jesus is right there in the middle of the room even if we do not see or feel his presence. And when we pray, we can be assured that we are never alone. In Matthew 28:20, Jesus said to remember that he is with us "always, even until the end of the age."


