Challenges Today Build Faith for Tomorrow

We love vacations so we can disappear to places where we won't face interruptions or unpredictable situations. Stress soon disappears, and we can finally relax. Time away is a reliable source of strengthening, but our faith is built most when we are faced with unforeseen challenges. And God uses challenges today for assignments tomorrow.

Way back in 735 BC, King Ahaz took the throne for Judah, but he was not prepared for what would confront him. Before he could sit down, Jerusalem was under military attack by the armies of a pair of kings who were allied. The Bible says King Ahaz was so afraid that he was shaking like tree branches in the wind. He felt terrorized!

The Lord saw the king's fear and sent the prophet Isaiah to encourage him. Isaiah said the attack would not stand. And the last part of Isaiah's prophecy for Ahaz has relevance for us today. Speaking to king Ahaz and all the people of Judah, the Lord said, "If you are not firm in your faith, then you will not be firm at all" (Isaiah 7:9b). This is pointed advice for a new leader. Your faith is not just an advantage to your religious life or your routine in worshipping God. Faith in God stabilizes your whole life, including your ability to serve as a leader. Wouldn't it have been great if Ahaz learned that lesson before he became king? If it was natural for him to seek and heed the advice of our Lord, he would have known that God was already aligned with Judah and defending Jerusalem.

But Ahaz did not listen.

In the gospel of John, we see Jesus getting his disciples ready for unique roles of serving the church after Jesus ascended into heaven. They would need to be ready to teach, preach, heal, and deliver people from all kinds of oppression. They could not be shaky in their faith. They would never be rich rulers or national kings, but they would ignite growth for a kingdom that would last forever: the glorious Kingdom of God.

Jesus trained his leaders before they knew what was happening, and this is often the case when Jesus builds our faith: we cannot see where we are going, so we must rely on our Master.

Jesus took the new disciples across the stormy sea of Galilee to a man possessed and oppressed by many demons. No one could control the man except Jesus, and the actions of Jesus sparked a revival there. Jesus was building the disciples' faith as they watched. Instead of traveling around Samaria, Jesus led his disciples through it. Jesus broke cultural traditions of ritual purity and had a meaningful and revealing discussion with a woman (continued on page 5)

at a well. The words of Jesus transformed her life; she sparked a revival there. It was in the borderlands that Jesus prepared his disciples to be fearless in taking the gospel to outsiders. Their faith in God grew firm. As we know from the book of Acts, some apostles (such as Peter) struggled with bringing the good news to gentiles. But they must have eventually realized that the challenging training in the borderlands was for a purpose. In the same way Jesus stopped for the one person suffering from sin, disease or oppression, they would stop for the one to share the powerful and transformational news of the Messiah.

As God challenges Unionville Church to reach those who have never heard the gospel and those who are suffering some kind of oppression, we need firm faith. And we need to learn from the Master: Jesus. The challenges we face today can equip us for expanding the kingdom of God tomorrow.

NANCY MOHRBACHER LISTON

"Everything happens for a reason! If it's meant to be, it will be!"



Nancy (Mohrbacher) Liston was born May 5, 1945, near Unionville in her grandparents' home to the late Henry and Zelma Mohrbacher. She was the oldest of four, including a sister, Sue Ann Evans, and brothers, John Mohrbacher and Mark Mohrbacher. Nancy was a 1963 graduate of Freedom Area High school and married Edward "Chuck" Liston of Hookstown. Together, they raised their family in Willowmere Park in Unionville, in a little house right below her parents. Nancy and Chuck's children—Crystal Liston Westover, Chucky Liston, and Craig Liston—also graduated from Freedom Area High School.

While in high school, Nancy was a member of the Sr. Tri-Hi-Y Club, Future Nurses, Future Homemakers of America, and the Shawnee Yearbook Staff. After graduation, Nancy attended the Ambridge Area

Public Schools, earning her diploma as a Licensed Practical Nurse. She was employed at Rochester Hospital and later at the Beaver Valley Geriatric Center, where she retired after 28 years of dedicated service.

Nancy was a wonderful wife, mother, and grandmother. Although diagnosed with a rare connective tissue disorder called Ehlers Danlos, Nancy never focused on herself, but rather always selflessly focused on serving and meeting the needs of others. As a faithful member of the Unionville Methodist Church, she was involved with many activities of the church. Her heart was committed to the Compassionate Care Ministry, coordinating the donation efforts of the food and clothing pantry. Through the years, Nancy made sure that countless families received assistance, particularly during Thanksgiving and Christmas. She was always concerned about the needs of others, and in 2005, she humbly received recognition as the Community Person of the Year.

Away from work and her ministry at the church, Nancy kept busy with her family life and various interests. She sold Avon and was recognized in 2013 for 30 years of dedicated service; taught ceramics in her basement for many years; did flower arrangements for many weddings; and also was the "manager" behind her son Chucky's D.J. gig.

Nancy took pride in her community and spearheaded a committee and effort to have a new Veterans' memorial Roll of Honor dedicated to the local heroes who served in American conflicts and wars. The Roll of Honor is located at the corner of the intersection of Route 68 and Glen Eden Road in New Sewickley Township. Nancy also adopted the cleanup and beautification of Burns Cemetery on Burns Road in New Sewickley Township. She always said she wanted to be buried there so that she could look down on the village of Unionville where she spent her entire life. Nancy got her wish and was laid to rest there in July 2013, and maintenance of the cemetery is kept up by her son, Craig Liston.

Nancy was a wonderful and loving daughter, sister, wife, mother and grandmother. She is greatly missed by her family and all those she touched in her short 68 years here with us.

Why Kids' Club?

Jordyn: "So we can maybe watch/listen to podcasts or watch videos."

Connor: "So we can watch videos on our lessons."

April: "I want a TV so we could watch videos about Jesus. It could be used for videos, lesson plans, and maybe Kahoot's about Jesus."

Taylor: "To listen to Jesus."

The lessons series we are using, provides video links to support each lesson. Having a TV in our room provides the youth with the opportunity to view these now and for future lessons.

Our leaders are planning to host movie nights for the youth and their friends as well as watching Steelers games together. The opportunities are endless. The high school Sunday school class is also utilizing this space every week and benefit from the TV as well.

The kick-off of our Fall Programming officially placed this room into use and so Wendy purchased a tv for the youth room and it is now in regular use. If you are inclined to do so, the youth group appreciates your help in funding the TV purchase. The youth will certainly appreciate any offering you can provide. We would not be where we are without all of your support.

Last week was our first meeting for which we had 8 youth in attendance. This makes our hearts very full and we encourage them to invite their friends. We are studying a lesson called "The Path" from Right Now Media. If anyone would like to look at it, it is saved in a "youth group" folder making it easy to find. "The Path" is about a journey that will change everything for a young lady named, Tal. It shows us that we were made for more than just knowing about the path of Jesus. We were made to experience it for ourself. The first lesson is called "The City: What are you searching for?". It portrays the life of a young professional trying to reach specific goals, pushing herself in her career, wanting to be like her parents, wanting to make them proud. Once she reached her goal, she then was looking further and seeking more and more advancement; wanting more. When do we reach our own fulfillment? When is enough, enough? Our path is not always a straight one, like we hope it will be, or should be.
