PASTOR'S CORNER

The Lord Fills the Hungry

How could Mary have had enough faith to believe what the angel told her? The instructions from the angel did not make sense, but after she thought about it, she said, "I am the Lord's servant" (Luke 1:38). Having a direct revelation from God would have been unusual at this time in history. The Old Testament is full of prophecies about the coming Messiah, but not during the 400 years before the birth of Jesus; this is sometimes called, "the silent years."


Like many other people anticipating the Messiah, Mary was hungry for good news from the Lord. She must have developed a relationship with God that went beyond what she saw and heard in the

natural world. She was a woman of faith; but imagine her shock when the angel said, "The Lord is with you!" This was a lot to process even before the angel got to the big news: that she would have a holy child who will be called the Son of God!

Later, when Mary and Elizabeth met together, she must have had time to process and reflect on what God was doing in both of their lives. As she glorified God, Mary was beaming. She said, "he has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty" (Luke 1:53). The news of the Messiah was joyful for those hungry to hear from God. Her exclamations remind us of Psalms written about the goodness of God, who satisfies the hungry:

"Oh, taste and see that the Lord is good!
Blessed is the man who takes refuge in him!
Oh, fear the Lord, you his saints,
for those who fear him have no lack!
The young lions suffer want and hunger;
but those who seek the Lord lack no good thing." (Psalm 34:8-10)

"For he (The Lord) satisfies the longing soul, and the hungry soul he fills with good things. (Psalm 107:9)



After multiplying bread for a hungry crowd, Jesus would explain that he was the bread from heaven sent to those with hungry souls. For the woman going to a well for water, he would offer living water that could satisfy spiritual thirst forever. He would walk past those who were content with the health of their hearts and heal those with diseases. He would overlook those who were satisfied with their own righteousness and share a meal with those who knew they needed to repent from sin. Jesus overlooked the proud but gave grace to the humble.

Jesus is fulfilling. He fills our needs. He knows our biggest need is himself. The best way to approach Jesus—when we need grace for salvation or when we need to speak to him in prayer—is to be hungry. He supports a certain kind of hunger when he says, "blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled." He accepts all who come to him—no matter the condition of their life or soul. He promises to accept those with needs when he says, "All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never cast out" (John 6:37).

What do you need Jesus to do for you? Have you spoken with him about it? Allow Jesus to fulfill of the Father's promise to give you everything you need. Jesus has a way of satisfying people in a way nothing on earth can satisfy. He is always ready to satisfy our hunger.

NOTE FROM PASTOR BARRY: We are using Sunday sermons in December to view the coming of our Messiah through the eyes of the prophet Isaiah, Joseph, Mary, a Bethlehem shepherd and a wise man from the East. As we follow these people to Bethlehem, their perspectives will deepen our understanding of the Messiah. We will rejoice together that Jesus is not just a Biblical figure but Emmanuel, God with us. Advent is also a time to praise God through music, so please join us for every service.

Despite a challenging year, Unionville overcame obstacles without major issues. The board approved a budget for 2026 that appears promising if our income remains steady, but continued careful spending is necessary.

The finance committee aims to control expenses while keeping ministries unchanged. If major repairs aren't needed, finances should be stable in 2026, though caution is advised. Parsonage rental income will be set aside for future repairs.

This year, the trustees encountered challenges in maintaining expenses at a manageable level and have identified certain items that would benefit from additional donation support. I recommend reaching out to the trustees for a detailed list of repairs or projects that require attention within the church.

The Western Pa Conference appointed Pastor Barry Henck, improving our pastor's budget and allowing us to restore the Trustee budget for 2026.

Over the past year, many of us have faced challenges and uncertainties brought about by decisions made at the United Methodist General Conference. Despite these motions and the changes implemented at the conference level, it is important to recognize that Unionville's core mission remains unchanged. We continue to stand firm in our dedication to serving our community and providing vital ministries and support to all who are in need. Our commitment to our neighbors and our ministry has not wavered, and we remain a steady presence for those who rely on us, regardless of external changes.

There has been no progress regarding disaffiliation within the United Methodist Church. As we begin the new year, please pray for Unionville to heal and move forward together, finding harmony and growing in God's love.
