Pastor's Corner

Waiting for the Holy Spirit

At our Pentecost Sunday worship service, we reviewed how God pours out his Spirit abundantly. We get more than expected and more than enough. But even though there is plenty for all of us, that does not mean God sends the Holy Spirit on our schedule.

As we hear in Acts 1, Jesus had instructed his followers to wait for the Holy Spirit in Jerusalem: “And while staying with them he [Jesus] ordered them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to WAIT for the promise of the Father, which, he said, ‘you heard from me’” (Acts 1:4).

Was God willing to send the Holy Spirit? Yes. Was the Holy Spirit promised to descend upon everyone? Yes. Did the early church need the Holy Spirit? Absolutely. But something happened first, and it is the same thing we need today: waiting. Waiting on the Lord is not wasted time; it is stubborn trust that God will deliver on his promises.

We hate to wait, and we have many technologies and cell phone apps to avoid waiting. Many companies (especially airlines) have discovered that people will pay extra fees to avoid waiting. We may feel like it’s a waste of time or even embarrassing to wait in a line.

But our patience in waiting may depend on what or for whom we are waiting. Waiting for the Lord is being humble and ready for something we cannot see. Sometimes I begin prayer sessions with this simple statement from Psalm 46:10: “Lord, I am still right now, and I know you are God.” Pausing to acknowledge God’s authority is a wonderful way to start waiting. And, just as it was for the early church, staying in the center of God’s will often means waiting together with a group of God’s people.

When the Holy Spirit fell powerfully in Acts 2, the believers were in one accord. We know Peter was there, but God was running the program. And it was several days of waiting. It may have been boring, or it could have been full of holy fear and trembling in the presence of the Lord. Did they understand the promise of the Father that Jesus was talking about?

Although the Bible does not tell us much about the upper room activities, we can guess with confidence that God’s people were praying together. They were being still and knowing that the Lord is the Lord. It was peaceful; perhaps there was music.

Are we patient enough to wait? It may help to remember that we are not waiting on an idea or a human; we are waiting on God, and God always delivers on promises. Waiting on the Lord can be satisfying because God makes all things beautiful in his time (Ecclesiastes 3:11). (continued on page 5)

We would rather work than wait. When we work for something spiritual, we feel like we are helping God—we want to force God's hand. We may think we are getting the attention of God or others waiting with us. Waiting can be humbling; we are all in the same position. And yet it may also be unifying.

Have you ever seen a chicken fly? Or, should I say, TRY to fly? Wings are flapping and feathers are flying, but the chicken never gets far off the ground. This is how I think of us working for the Lord to pour out the Holy Spirit. We do a lot of flapping, we make noise, and we may throw feathers into the air, but we do not reach the sky. It can also be tiring trying to get the Lord to act on our schedule.

Now, in contrast, think of a bald eagle soaring effortlessly in the summer sky, high above a dark blue lake in the Allegheny National Forest. The eagle glides through the air without much flapping. That is a picture of waiting that the prophet Isaiah painted for us: "they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint" (Isaiah 40:31).

The early disciples of Jesus who listened to his directions and waited in Jerusalem may have gotten bored, but the payoff was incredible and memorable. They were all filled with the power of the Holy Spirit, and the church took some giant leaps forward. Waiting together for the Holy Spirit is always worth the wait.

Exodus 3:1-4 Now Moses was tending the flock of Jethro his father-in-law, the priest of Midian, and he led the flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God.

There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in flames of fire from within a bush. Moses saw that though the bush was on fire it did not burn up. So Moses thought, "I will go over and see this strange sight—why the bush does not burn up."

When the Lord saw that he had gone over to look, God called to him from within the bush, "Moses! Moses!" And Moses said, "Here I am."

If you are not familiar with or need a refresher on the story, jump into your bible, starting at Exodus chapter 3. I will be paraphrasing some of the rest of the story as I continue my thoughts.

Turns out that God had a very big ask of Moses and true to human nature when there's a big ask, our human response is often times filled with all the reasons why we can't, and such was the response of Moses! True to God's nature, he provided for every one of Moses' perceived obstacles and after some "but God" moments, Moses accepted the call to lead the Israelites out of Egypt and into the Promised Land.

As I think about personal experiences, I have found myself wondering about God's calling. God answered the immediate questions that Moses had, but...had he known that he would be wandering around the desert for 40 years with a bunch of whining, complaining stiff necked people, would he have still said yes? Had he known that losing his temper would keep himself out of the Promised Land, would he have still said yes? There he was just living his life, tending the flocks, all kinds of "me" time, no one to answer to but the sheep, *(at least that's how I picture it)*...but he said, "yes".

And then there is Mary, planning her future with the man she is promised to, when suddenly everything changes with God's call on her life, what an honor to be chosen as the mother of God's only Son, but....did she know what was being asked of Joseph, that this promised son would be shared with the world, that her mother's heart would be torn in two as she would witness his horrific death on the cross?

For the disciples, it was a mere, "Come follow me and I will make you fishers of men". What does that even mean? Were there questions? We know they were told to deny self and follow Jesus, to lay down their "nets", their current lives and follow Jesus, to give up all their wealth and families and follow Jesus.

In 1896 a man named Judson W. Van DeVenter, wrote a well-known hymn titled "*I Surrender All*". The hymn reflects a personal testimony of surrendering one's entire life and will to Jesus Christ. Judson became a successful art teacher after graduating from college and he was actively involved in church ministry, especially in music.

For five years, Van DeVenter wrestled with the decision whether to pursue full-time ministry or to continue his promising career in art. The struggle was real, as heart and mind pulled him in both directions. Eventually the call to surrender became so great that one evening, kneeling in prayer, he gave his life fully to Christ's service, giving up his art career for evangelism. Out of that moment of surrender came the words to the hymn—a personal prayer turned into a universal song of *commitment*.

Following the decision to enter ministry, Van DeVenter traveled extensively as an evangelist throughout the United States, England and Scotland. He influenced a generation of Christian leaders including a young Billy Graham.

God's call is not always convenient, it sometimes supersedes our own desires, it is most often open ended, the details are not always laid out, there is no promise of an easy road but...the impact is immense! We may never know the lives we will touch, the seeds we will plant, the faith that we will help to mature—or even how big our faith will become and the blessings we will receive along the way. When the call comes, and it will, will you surrender some, will you pick and choose, set boundaries, or....will you surrender all?!!

CLAYTON'S ARMY THANKS YOU!

The Pittsburgh Region Cystic Fibrosis Foundation's Great Strides 5K Walk took place on Saturday May 16. More than 30 teams participated. This year we walked the wooded trails of Hartwood Acres. While donations are still coming in, as of today (May 18) \$250,674.00 has been raised for cystic fibrosis research.

Clayton's Army -- made up of 19 walkers (including 8 year old Clayton and his two youngest cousins -- Jackson 9 and Brevin 6) raised \$4,495.00 of that total. Nancy and I and the 34 individuals, families, and organizations from the Aliquippa, Monaca, and Unionville Churches who supported us donated \$1,210.00 of Clayton's Army's total. (And we know more donations are coming -- people told us so. We'll let you know as the totals change.)

We want to thank all of you for your support. Once again, donors contributed anywhere from \$5.00 to \$100.00. You have helped to make a difference. This is especially true when, as we were told, the Federal government provides practically nothing for CF research. Since Clayton was born, several new treatments have been developed and approved. The average life-expectancy for people with CF has now risen to 50 which is nearly 3 decades longer than it was when David's graduate school roommate was working with CF patients at UCLA in 1972.

We thank you. Clayton and his parents -- Dale and Jennifer -- thank you. And so do the more than 40,000 "kids" who deal with CF every day. You are a blessing!
